Follow your interests in upper-division courses in literature, cultural studies, writing, and language, e.g. ENGL 3183, 3933, 3203, 3030.	Continue to build advanced skills and expertise in English through upper-division courses and electives, e.g. ENGL 4100, 4310, 4083.
Your Experience	Meet other students and faculty who share your interests by attending creative writing readings, visiting speaker events, and film screenings.	Explore research and study abroad opportunities, such as Wentz research scholars and Cowboys in Cambridge.	Take an experiential summer course at the Doel Reed Center in Taos, NM. Work closely with specialist faculty on original research or an honors thesis.	Present your research at the Southern Plains Conference or Undergraduate Research Symposium.
