Dr. Stiles is an Associate Professor in the English department at Saint Louis University, where she teaches courses on Victorian literature, children's literature, and medical humanities. In spring 2015, she received an Innovative Teaching Fellowship from SLU's Reinert Center for Transformative Teaching and Learning, which supported the development of English 349: Public Health and the Victorian Built Environment.

Stiles's research explores intersections between literature, science, and religion. She is the author of *Popular Fiction and Brain Science in the Late Nineteenth Century* (Cambridge UP, 2012) and the editor of *Neurology and Literature, 1866-1920* (Palgrave, 2007). She also co-edited two volumes published by Elsevier in 2013 as part of their *Progress in Brain Research* series.
