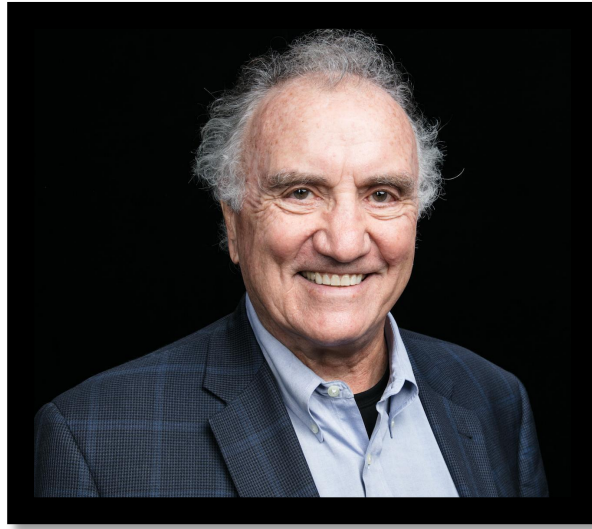


Linguistic Diversity in Higher Education:
