- Monday, December 10 3:30 PM AG Hall 201. Dr. Kunwar Singh is currently an Associated Scientist at the Center for Geospatial Research, University of Georgia, and a Postdoctoral Research Fellow in the Department of Forestry and Environmental Resources, North Carolina State University. Dr. Singh received his PhD in Forestry and Environmental Resources from North Carolina State University in 2014.
- Wednesday, December 12 3:30 PM NRC 207. Dr. Gehendra Kharel is currently a Postdoctoral Research Associate at Oklahoma State University, and received his PhD in Earth System Science and Policy from the University of North Dakota in 2015.

Dr. Thomas LaVanchy, November 28, "Coupled Perspectives on Water Security." Dr. LaVanchy is currently an Adjunct Assistant Professor in the Department of Geography and the Environment, University of Denver. He received his PhD in Geography from the University of Denver in 2015.

Dr. Michael Acheampong, November 29, "Pursuing Sustainable Development Goal Number One: Has the Ship Sailed for Farmers in Ghana's Oil City?" Dr. Acheampong is currently a Visiting Assistant Professor in the Department of Geography, Oklahoma State University. He received his PhD in Geography and Environmental Science & Policy from the University of South Florida in 2018.

Dr. Ranjeet John, November 30, "Canopy cover and herbaceous above ground biomass in Mongolia and Inner Mongolia: spatiotemporal estimates and controlling factors." Dr. John is currently a Visiting Assistant Professor in the Department of Geography, Oklahoma State University. He received his PhD in Biology (Ecology) from the University of Toledo in 2010.

Dr. Hamed Gholizadeh, December 4, "A Bird's-eye View of Grassland Biodiversity." Dr. Gholizadeh is currently a Postdoctoral Research Associate in the School of Natural Resources, University of Nebraska-Lincoln, and received his PhD in Geography from Indiana University in 2016.
