During Geography Awareness Week (Nov. 15-19), a PhotoVoice contest was held. Congratulations to our winners:


1st Place: Paris Dirksen won \$50, two free items at Chick-Fil-A, and one free item at the Garage. A poster version is shown below.

department on November 30.






