#### **CURRENT RESEARCH**

My dissertation research investigates citizenship politics in India, structural changes in citizenship discourse, and citizen identity. In 2019, India passed the Citizenship Amendment Act (CAA), which fast tracks the citizenship process for certain religious groups. Many referred to this Act as unconstitutional because it violates the forty-second amendment of the constitution,

which asserts secularism. Others feared that the Act is a step taken towards the Hindu nationalist agenda. In my research, I investigate interconnected identities, structural shifts, and analyze how people in India make sense of citizenship, the CAA, and citizen identity using oral history interviews and Interpretive Phenomenological Analysis (IPA).
